How Does the LINX System

The LINX Reflux Management System augments the weak LES, reinforcing the body's natural

The LINX System is a small, flexible band of magnets enclosed in titanium beads. The beads are connected by titanium wires. The magnetic

(see Figure 4). Magnetic attraction between the beads closes the LES after swallowing, to reinforce

What Happens After Treatment? Following the procedure, under a physician's guidance, patients should be able to resume a normal diet immediately and will typically resume normal activities in less than a week. Side effects are generally minimal and resolve over time. Your physician will be able to give you more information.
